PETER RUTLEDGE KOCH has been designing and printing limited-edition books, portfolios, and broadsides since 1974. Recognized as one of the most accomplished typographic designers of his generation, his training, influences, and achievements place him squarely in the lineage of San Francisco literary fine press printers.

For this exhibition, Stanford Libraries curatorial partners Roberto Trujillo and Elizabeth Fischbach, selected books, prints, and ephemera from Koch's long trajectory of design thinking, experimentation, and collaborations with artists, type designers, poets, papermakers, and binders. The works on display span wide-ranging territory, from cowboy surrealism to pre-Socratic philosophy, and from contemporary and Renaissance poetry to hard-hitting photo-based requiems to the American West.

A three-volume catalogue and descriptive bibliography published in 2017 on the occasion of the original exhibition at Stanford University includes essays that speak to the intellectual and artistic value of Koch's work.
